Commercial Rent Delinquency			
The text is listed:			
In March 2021, Supervisor Ronen's office	requested the Board's Budget a	nd Legislative Analyst (B	LA) to prov

report estimating the amount of unpaid commercial rent in the City and County of San Francisco due to the COVID-19 pandemic and related to public health orders. The report estimated nearly 200 million dollars on the low side of commercial back rent and over 400 million dollars on the high side. This data was reported by the BLA 9 months ago and our recovery efforts have continued to be stifled by the Delta Variant. As a result, today, I think it is safe to estimate that commercial back rent delinquency is more than a half billion dollars in our City. My office has asked the Board's Budget and Legislative Analyst to do an updated estimate which we expect to receive by Tuesday, September 21. With an assumed half billion dollars in commercial rent delinquency, and businesses throughout San Francisco pleading for more support that is not in the form of government loans, my question to you, Mayor Breed, is: What are you doing or what do you plan to do to avoid this potential avalanche of small business closure and significant job loss that is projected to occur after the commercial lease moratorium expires on 30th of this month?
