25 Section 2. Authorization to accept and expend grant funds.

1 (a) The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the District Attorney to 2 accept and expend, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, U.S. Department of 3 Justice grant funds in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the Justice Reinvestment Initiative, which 4 aims to develop and implement innovative and research-based responses that address a 5 range of criminal justice system problems through the following strategies and activities: (1) 6 creation of the Young Adult Justice Initiative Workgroup whose activities will include the 7 development of a Young Adult Action Plan examination of the justice continuum through the 8 Sequential Intercept Model - including pre-adjudication and post-release; and (2) 9 subsequently expanding services and alternative approaches to address young people in 10 contact with San Francisco's justice system. 11 (b) The District Attorney proposes to maximize use of available grant 12 funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget, and 13 indirect costs are hereby waived. 14 (c) The total personnel budget for the two (2) new positions (2.0 FTE) is \$687,793 15 of the total grant award of \$1,000,000 for the term October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2023. 16 The balance of the grant award is allocated to pay for \$2,810 in technological supplies, \$2,997 17 in printing costs, and \$306,400 in contractual services. 18 Section 3. LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - U.S. Department of Justice - Justice Reinvestment Initiative - Amendment to Annual Salary Ordinance - FYs 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 -\$1,000,000]

Ordinance retroactively authorizing the Office of the District Attorney to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$1,000,000 from the U.S. Department of Justice to fund the Justice Reinvestment Initiative; and amending Ordinance No. 166-20 (Annual Salary Ordinance File No. 200568 for Fiscal Years (FYs) 2020-2021 and 2021-2022) to provide for the addition of two grant funded Class 8133 Victim/Witness Investigator III positions (FTE 2.0) in the Office of the District Attorney for the period of October 1, 2020, through September 30, 2023.

Background Information

The Justice Reinvestment Initiative is a District Attorney-led program that aims to develop and implement innovative and research-based responses to a range of criminal justice system problems through the following actions: (1) creation of the Young Adult Justice Initiative Workgroup, which will use the Sequential Intercept Model to examine the experience of young adults at various points in the justice system, including pre-adjudication and post-release; and (2) expanding the use of alternatives to incarceration and social services to support young people in contact with San Francisco's justice system.

Proposed Ordinance

The proposed ordinance retroactively authorizes the District Attorney to accept and expend a \$1,000,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to support the Justice Reinvestment Initiative. The grant term is October 1, 2020, through September 30, 2023. The grant does not include a provision for indirect costs. The grant funds will be used to pay for staff salaries in the office of the District Attorney, and to pay for contractual services provided by third parties to implement the goals of the program, technological supplies, and printing costs.

Pursuant to Administrative Code §10.170-1(b), the ordinance also amends the Annual Salary Ordinances for FYs 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 to reflect the addition of two grant funded Class 8133 Victim/Witness Investigator III positions (FTE .08 for FY 2020-2021, and FTE 1.50 for FY 2021-2022).

Congratulations on your recent award. (1) New construction.

(2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including property (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for an endangered species.

(3) A renovation which will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size.

(4) Research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment.

(5) Implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals.

Additionally, the proposed action is neither a phase nor a segment of a project which when reviewed in its entirety would not meet the criteria for a categorical exclusion.

Consequently, the subject federal action meets the Office of Justice Programs' criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4(b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
