3	Resolution supporting the Democratic leadership in the California Senate and
4	Assembly in their efforts to negotiate a budget solution based on a unified set of
5	Democratic values.
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7	WHEREAS, on May 14th, 2010, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger released the May
8	Revision to his FY 2010-11 Proposed Budget for the State of California; and
9	WHEREAS the Governor's May Revision contains significant cuts to education and
10	critical social programs, including the elimination of CalWORKs and state supported
	child care; and
11	WHEREAS the Governor's May Revision increases student fees in both the California
12	State University (CSU) and University of California (UC) systems and requires Medi-Cal
13	recipients to pay more for many services; and
14	WHEREAS, on Tuesday, May 25 th , 2010, California State Assembly Speaker John A.
15	Perez released the Assembly's Democratic budget proposal, also known as the California
16	Jobs Budget; and
	WHEREAS, the California Jobs Budget proposes to solve the State's \$17.9 billion
17	General Fund shortfall while creating private sector jobs and preventing harmful cuts to
18	schools, public safety, and the state's safety net; and
19	WHEREAS, the California Jobs Budget maintains critical education dollars, welfare to
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21	work, childcare, and cost effective alternatives to expensive nursing homes; invests in critical
22	job training programs; and jumpstarts California's clean and green industries and other
	targeted jobs investments; and
23	WHEREAS, the California Jobs Budget delays the implementation of corporate
24	loopholes and closes the California Oil Severance Tax loophole; and
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2	WHEREAS, on June 21, 2010 Senate President pro Tem Darrell Steinberg and
3	Senator Denise Moreno Duchenys, Chair of the Senate Budget and Fiscal Review
4	Committee, released the Senate Democratic Restructuring Budget Proposal; and
5	WHEREAS, the Senate Democratic Restructuring Budget Proposal implements
6	reforms that shrink state government, increase government efficiency, and reduce the size of
7	the state's structural deficit; and
8	WHEREAS, the Senate Democratic Restructuring Budget Proposal improves
9	government accountability by clarifying areas of responsibility for state and local governments
10	and begins to transfer \$3-4 billion worth of public safety, human services, and health
11	investments to counties to administer along with a revenue stream that does not increase the
12	existing tax burden on regular Californians; now, therefore be it
13	RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors believes these Democratic
14	proposals are reasonable and responsible alternatives to the Governor's recent May Budget
15	Revision; and be it
16	FURTHER RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors supports the
17	Democratic leadership in the California Senate and Assembly in their efforts to negotiate a
18	budget solution based on a unified set of Democratic values.
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
