| 12 | recreational roadways, pathways, and trails, and to minimize motor vehicle traffic; and            |
| 13 | WHEREAS, Also in 1998, Proposition J - Golden Gate Park Revitalization Act                         |
| 14 | established the Concourse Authority to oversee the construction of privately funded                |
| 15 | Concourse Garage and related, publicly funded transit improvements; and                            |
| 16 | WHEREAS, Starting in 1969, the eastern half of John F. Kennedy (JFK) Drive was                     |
| 17 | closed to cars every Sunday; and   |
| 18 | WHEREAS, In 2007, then-Supervisor Jake McGoldrick in File No. 070489, on file with                 |
| 19 | the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 210944, which is hereby declared to be a         |
| 20 | part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, established "Healthy Saturdays," closing     |
| 21 | certain roads in Golden Gate Park including the eastern half of JFK Drive on Saturdays             |
| 22 | between April and September; and   |
| 23 | WHEREAS, In 2005, the Board of Supervisors passed a Resolution File No. 051247,                    |
| 24 | on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 210944, which is hereby declared    |
| 25 | to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, approving the Golden Gate Park Music |

| 6  | creating a bicycle and pedestrian pathway from the beach to the far east side of the park,    |

| 8  | WHEREAS, In working with the city government, the M.H. de Young Memorial Museum               |
| 9  | (de Young) built its loading docks on JFK Drive when rebuilding the institution, allowing for |
| 10 | freight delivery trucks to enter JFK Drive from the north in order to reach the museum's      |
| 11 | loading docks, and the arrangement will continue to be monitored, evaluated, and modified for |
| 12 | effectiveness and safety; and   |
| 13 | WHEREAS, The western half of JFK Drive is on the Vision Zero High Injury Map, and             |
| 14 | since the road closures on Martin Luther King Jr. (MLK) Drive and JFK Drive, there have not   |
| 15 | been any reported collisions of bicyclists or pedestrians; and                                |
| 16 | WHEREAS, Bicycle and pedestrian safety improvements have been continually made                |
| 17 | in Golden Gate Park, including through the Golden Gate Park Safety Project, and safety        |

| 12 | such as Golden Gate Park and may have to choose between an hour long bus ride or driving        |

| 14 | WHEREAS, Other modes of sustainable transportation may not be as easy,                          |
| 15 | accessible, or affordable for these historically underserved communities; and                   |
| 16 | WHEREAS, Several institutions in Golden Gate Park draw millions of visitors in pre-             |
| 17 | pandemic years including the Japanese Tea Garden, de Young Museum, and California               |
| 18 | Academy of Sciences, serving not only San Francisco residents of all ages and abilities, but    |
| 19 | also non-residents and regional tourists who may be relying upon a vehicle to access the        |

#### Dear Chair Melgar, Vice Chair Preston, and Supervisor Peskin:

I strongly support the provisions of the "Beach to Bay" resolution that call for (1) creating a car-free route through Golden Gate Park from Stanyon Street to Ocean Beach for pedestrians and bicyclists; (2) increasing the accessibility of the Park from low-income, historically underserved communities and for low-income households; (3) improving public transit service to the Park from all San Francisco neighborhoods; and (4) enhancing pedestrian and bicycle connections to the Park.

Other elements of the resolution, however, conflict those goals or the Transit First mandates of San Francisco's Charter. Providing free parking to affluent residents of Russian Hill, Telegraph Hill, and Westwood Park and to wealthy retirees from Atherton, Belvedere, and Blackhawk who possess a disabled persons placard does nothing to advance equity and undermines the City's Transit First policies.

I urge the Committee to revise the Resolution in the following respects:

- 1. Limit any reduced-price parking in the Music Concourse garage to low-income households. In particular, allowing all residents of the four specified zip codes to park in the garage for free conflicts with the requirement of the Charter that parking policies for areas well served by transit must encourage travel by transit and alternative transportation. The zip codes are not well-tailored to encompass lower income neighborhoods with poor transit access to the park. At least two of the zip codes include substantial areas that are not remotely lower income. Zip code 94112, where I live, includes Westwood Park, Mission Terrace, and parts of Sunnyside. In addition, Muni routes 29 and 43 both directly connect neighborhoods throughout 94112 to Golden Gate Park in substantially less than one hour. Zip code 94133 includes much of the Telegraph Hill and Russian Hill neighborhoods, while excluding much of Chinatown.
- 2. Possession of a Disabled Person Placard should not by itself entitle a person to park for free within the Concourse garage. Disabled Person Placards are provided to individuals without regard to income or wealth. The placard program is also notoriously subject to abuse.
- 3. The 8th Avenue/Fulton Street entrance should not be reopened to cars. Opening the 8th Avenue entrance is likely to lead to conflicts between cars, bicyclists, and pedestrians. Vehicles with disabled, senior, or limited mobility visitors approaching the Park from the north should instead be encouraged to use the 10th Avenue entrance to the Music Concourse garage. By driving through the garage, they may gain access to the museums, the concourse, and the ADA parking behind the band shell.

The resolution keeps a connection that people have found joy, transportation, and health through walking, biking, roller skating, and otherwise traveling without the danger of automobiles. It strengthens ways for people to get to Golden Gate Park without a car or with different forms of mobility.

I question however opening the 8th Avenue entrance to private automobiles. Without stricter controls, I am afraid that this will lead to more injuries and deaths with people using JFK Drive; slow down the Muni 44 O'Shaughessy bus that provides much needed bus access; and worsen the experience of people who use JFK Drive and the Music Concourse.

I was recently waiting to turn left from westbound Market Street onto southbound Valencia Street on a bicycle, using the wait. When the signal came for me to cross, I started to cross but stopped because someone in a car drove through the red light and almost hit me. I am concerned and afraid that opening 8th Avenue to private vehicles will open more potential for conflicts.

I do not see how opening the 8th Avenue entrance to private cars solves a problem. People in private automobiles can still access the Music Concourse and the south side of the park through the garage entrance at 10th Avenue and Fulton Street.

I urge you to explore and find a solution that dis-incentivizes people from using the Music Concourse road to cut across the north and south sides of Golden Gate Park.

Every day, I ride my bike from 45th street in the Richmond (District 1) to Castro for my job.

I would take a car, but cars are incredibly expensive. I'm unclear how anyone but the very wealthy can afford to live *and* drive here. I would take the bus, but on a good day, it takes 40 minutes (taking the 5R, and then the 33).

And so I bike through JFK, which takes about 25 minutes.

And a few times a month, someone tries to kill me and other pedestrians and families with their car; often at the spaces where human-safe and car spaces intermingle.

Yesterday, (Sunday the 19th), near Bernice Rodgers Way and JFK, a man drove *on the sidewalk* to skirt past the barriers, and then tried to ram a man on his bicycle. At first, I thought this was a traffic accident. But then, the driver backed up 15 ft or so, accelerated, and then tried to ram me with his car.

At the last moment, he swerved into the safe-hit posts at the fork of MLK and Bernie Rodgers, and immediately accelerated towards a mother and father pushing their child in a stroller, eventually swerving out of the way, and driving off.

I don't blame other drivers for this guy's malice, but cars and people don't mix. There's no safe way to allow a pass through on JFK and 8th avenue. The dangerous parts are always these intersections, please don't create another one.

Dear Ms. Major and Supervisors Melgar, Peskin and Preston,

Supervisor Chan's well-meaning resolution, attempting a "compromise" related to access barriers caused by the closure of JFK Drive in Golden Gate Park, unfortunately only attempts to solve one of the *myriad* problems caused by the closure.

Supervisor Chan, including much of the general public, has been misled by numerous articles and commentaries in the public media, which have erroneously framed the closure of JFK Drive as a struggle between the DeYoung museum and the Bicycle Coalition. Would that it were as simple as that!

The closure of JFK Drive cuts off easy access for the majority of San Franciscans, Bay Area residents, and tourists to *nearly all* of the most popular attractions in Golden Gate Park. These include, among others, the Rhododendron Dell, the Dahlia Garden, Stow Lake, Pioneer Falls, the Model Boat Lagoon, the Fly-Fishing Pond, and the Buffalo Paddock.

Access to all of these attractions is effectively eliminated for most people with vision and mobility disabilities, seniors, countless families with small children, and almost anyone who must travel to Golden Gate Park from outside the City, or from residents of neighborhoods in the South or Southeast of town, who are mostly working families of color. It is wildly impractical, exclusionary, and horribly inequitable.

In addition, the City currently lacks, and will lack for the foreseeable future, the public transit infrastructure that could support the proposed closure! Last month, Jeffrey Tumlin clearly stated on public radio that Muni only has adequate funding for full service until 2022. After that, Muni service will have to be significantly cut back.

Furthermore, during the pandemic, many who used to regularly ride public transit returned to driving because of fears of the transmissibility of Covid-19. Now, amid widespread concern about the even more transmissible Delta variant, people have continued to avoid buses and trains, preferring to remain in their cars for safety.

The Golden Gate Park Shuttle, the planned alternative to provide access for those who cannot walk, run, cycle or skate to the areas of the Park they want to visit, is barely functional. It has only one driver, and makes unpredictable and infrequent runs. Many of its stops, which are too far apart, lack benches, timetables, and other access features that visitors need to effectively use it. Fully staffing the Shuttle, and providing enough vehicles and appropriately furnished stops, will cost hundreds of thousands of dollars which neither RPD, MTA or the City itself currently have in their budgets.

All of these problems point to the main difficulty with this terrible, insane process. The planning for it was entirely reactive, and was done completely backwards.

Though I have no doubt that many at SFCTA, MTA, RPD, MOD, and Walk San Francisco worked very hard on the plan, it began with a pre-chosen goal, closing JFK Drive, and worked backwards from that point, overlooking many of the serious problems the closure would cause. The current neighborhood meetings, hosted by MTA, to get feedback from the public about how best to ameliorate these problems now that the plan is in place, resemble the actions of a software company that trumpets the release of a miraculous new product, only to be forced to develop patch after patch, year after year, to remedy its many serious faults, one by one.

An appropriate plan for the future of Golden Gate Park would have begun with questions, rather than preconceived answers. The question, "How can we provide the easiest and safest access to the most attractions for the most visitors, of all backgrounds, abilities and ages?" was clearly never asked at the outset.

As a positive contrast, consider what was accomplished by GGNRA when it provided full, world-class access during its renovations at Crissy Field and Lands End. These wonderful places now have universal access, by many different means, for young, old, disabled and non-disabled, athletic and non-athletic people from all over the Bay Area. The concepts and precepts of Universal Design were used throughout the entire endeavor. That is the reason, for example, that many of the drinking fountains at Crissy Field are at not two, but three heights: the tallest for adults, the middle height for wheelchair users and kids, and the lowest, for everyone's dogs!

Truly inclusive, open, tolerant and creative thinking was never used when developing the current plan for the closure of JFK Drive. It was shot through with implicit and partisan bias against people who weren't even considered at the outset! It was designed for the enjoyment of the most physically able and athletic San Franciscans, who live closest to Golden Gate Park, at the expense of *everyone* else!

I hope this isn't an indication that the inclusive, open and creative City that I moved to forty-three years ago hasn't morphed into a mere collection of self-interested, greedy, competitive and cruel individuals. I hope we can move back into the open, big-hearted, egalitarian and creative space we used to occupy, a space epitomized by Golden Gate Park itself.

This Comment OPPOSES approval of this Committee's Agenda Item 4 described above. Please distribute this Comment to all Members of the Committee and place a copy in applicable files and packets of the Board of Supervisors.

Access to the major part of Golden Gate Park was closed to vehicles in March, 2020, as part of the alleged "emergency" need for bicyclists and pedestrians to occupy public streets in San Francisco to facilitate their recreational needs during the Covid "emergency." The Agenda Item 4 apparently now proposes creation of a "Beach to Bay Car-Free Connection and Equitable Access to Golden Gate Park" by closing access via JFK Drive.

The closure of JFK Drive Project has received **NO** environmental review, and it **is** *not* **exempt** from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") There is NO CEQA document in the File No. 210944. To comply with CEQA, environmental review must *precede* any Project approval.

Further, this expedited item violates the Brown Act, since adequate notice has not preceded consideration of this Item. The Project clearly also violates the ADA, since closing access to vehicles precludes access to the park by disabled people.

Closing access to vehicles to the central attractions of Golden Gate Park, including the concourse, the DeYoung Museum, Conservatory of Flowers and other famous Park features,

will not help those who travel to the park from distant locations in the City and outside of the City, seniors and those with disabilities, and families with children.

The closure of access to vehicles on public streets is also preempted and violates the Vehicle Code.

Please stop closing public streets for exclusionary "car-free" use.

Dear Supervisor Melgar & Staff,

My name is Jessica Jenkins, I am a District 5 resident. I have a 6 year old son, and we walk or bike to Golden Gate Park several times a week. We also use JFK to safely get to destinations in the Richmond and Sunset. I've taught 2 of his friends to bike in the past year, and a critical part of our childcare and transit situation is being able to safely bike through Golden Gate Park and on slow streets with multiple kids on their own bikes.

Supervisor Connie Chan has introduced a resolution on Car-Free Golden Gate Park to be heard by the Land Use Committee on Monday. I appreciate its points about improving pedestrian & bike infrastructure, transit frequency, ADA access, and addressing mismanagement of the 800+ spot parking garage with direct access to the museums.

However, it proposes allowing private vehicle traffic to cut-through the park at 8th Ave, which I am strongly opposed to:

- Allowing private vehicles to cut-through JFK at 8th Ave severely diminishes JFK's usability for children and other other vulnerable road users that are walking and rolling. While I can currently let my child ride his own bike on JFK all the way from Kezar to Transverse Dr, that will no longer be possible with cut-through traffic at 8th.
- In the discussion of how low-income children access Golden Gate Park and its museums, SFUSD's use of Muni and walking for field trips has been completely ignored. My child is a 1st grader in SFUSD, and I have been volunteering in SFUSD classrooms for 4 years. I frequently chaperone field trips and have been to the DeYoung twice with Muir Elementary classes. This set of (mostly low-income) SFUSD students gets to Golden Gate Park and its museums via Muni and walking. Increasing car traffic in GGP does nothing to increase their access; it only increases the stress of walking with a large group of students from the Muni 5, 7, or N stops through the park.
- With 8th Ave closed at JFK, traffic on 8th Ave has decreased significantly, and it has become an important north-south connector for biking families that need to get to Mountain Lake Park, Geary Blvd, Clement St, and Lake St. 8th Ave was supposed to be

- a neighborway "to create a safe and pleasant north-south route for people walking and biking in the Inner Richmond". However, the pedestrian and bike infrastrucutre was watered down, and it was unusable for children until the closure of JFK to private vehicles significantly decreased traffic on 8th Ave as well.
- Access to the museums via private vehicle should be primarily through the undeground parking garage, and the museum concourse and JFK should be preserved as a "pedestrian oasis" as intended by voters when Proposition J authorizing construction of the garage was passed in 1998.

I urge you to amend the resolution to only allow public transit vehicles access to the Museum Concourse at 8th Ave.
