1 IUrging the Pause of the COVID Booster Administration to the General Population and Supporting Patent Waiver and Technology Information Transfer of Vaccines to Countries that 2 Do Not Have Access] 3 4 Resolution urging President Joe Biden to pause distribution of COVID vaccine 5 boosters to the general population and to take a leadership role in supporting the 6 Trade-Related Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) waiver while promoting technology 7 information transfer as it relates to vaccinations to low-to-middle income countries in 8 order to end this global pandemic. 9 WHEREAS, In December of 2019, a new virus known as COVID-19 (the "virus") was 10 11 first detected and began to rapidly spread globally – killing people all over the world; and 12 WHEREAS, On March 11, 2020, Director General of the World Health Organization ("WHO"), Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, characterized the virus a global pandemic as the 13 number of deaths and affected countries grew; and 14 WHEREAS, At the start of 2021, wide distribution and administration of vaccines began 15 in the United States with thousands of vaccination sites popping up all over the country; and 16 WHEREAS, In March of 2021, the Biden Administration announced that the U.S. 17 Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") would invest \$10 billion to expand access 18 to vaccines and better serve low-income people of color and other underserved communities 19 in response to the virus, citing equity as the center of the government's virus response; and 20 21 WHEREAS, By the beginning of August 2021, over 50% of the entire U.S population had been fully vaccinated in contrast to low-income countries such as Ghana with 1% of the 22 23 population fully vaccinated; and 24 25

WHEREAS, 80% of the vaccines administered globally have gone to high and upper middle income countries despite these places accounting for less than half of the world's
 population and only 0.4% of doses administered have been in low-income countries; and
 WHEREAS, With the emergence of new variants of the virus, including the delta
 variant, the Biden Administration initially proposed a plan to roll out booster shots to all eligible
 individuals who have been fully vaccinated; and

WHEREAS, The WHO has called for a global moratorium on booster shots until the
end of the year so that vaccine supplies could be redirected, highlighting the stark inequalities
in providing boosters in high income countries while the global poor remains unvaccinated;

10 and

WHEREAS, The WHO called on countries to stop providing extra doses of the vaccine
or boosters until all nations vaccinate at least 40% of their population by the end of the year;
and

14 WHEREAS, Public health officials and experts are skeptical of the booster's 15 effectiveness on fully vaccinated persons who are neither immunocompromised or 65 and 16 older given the lack of supporting evidence and believe that vaccinating more people globally 17 will have a greater effect of reducing the chances of another variant emerging; and 18 WHEREAS, On September 17, 2021, The U.S. Food and Drug Administration's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee rejected a broad application to 19 20 approve booster doses for everyone between the ages of 16 and 64 who are fully vaccinated 21 and not immunocompromised; and 22 WHEREAS, After much pushback and expert recommendations, the Biden

23 Administration has agreed to now only roll out boosters for immunocompromised persons and

24 persons 65 and older but has not indicated when boosters will be distributed amongst fully

25 vaccinated persons 16 and older; and

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WHEREAS, The United States government has a surplus of vaccines, specifically 116
 doses per 100 people, while low-income countries such as Yemen only have 1.1 doses per
 100 people; and

WHEREAS, The Biden Administration has an ethical duty to distribute this surplus to
countries in need as opposed to providing its citizens with additional boosters with little
scientific data pertaining to its effectiveness on people who are neither immunocompromised
nor 65 and older; and

8 WHEREAS, Doctors warn that when vaccines are not globally available, more 9 countries will have uncontrolled outbreaks and new variants will emerge; and

WHEREAS, The United States, being one of the wealthiest countries globally, has a
moral obligation to the rest of the world to help bring an end to this pandemic; and

12 WHEREAS, This virus does not care about borders and will continue to spread and 13 mutate across the world if we do not get most of the global population vaccinated; and

WHEREAS, With diminished access to hospitals, ventilators, oxygen, and antiviral
drugs, these poor countries are suffering and their people are dying; and

16 WHEREAS, In order for these low to middle income countries to effectively vaccinate 17 their population, they need not only vaccine supply but a way for them to produce their own 18 vaccines and the infrastructure to go along with it; and

WHEREAS, The supply of vaccines is limited and will continue to be until supply is
 increased via the Trade-Related Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) waiver ("the waiver") and
 technology information transfer; and

WHEREAS, The TRIPS waiver, first proposed in October of 2020 for members of the World Trade Organization ("WTO) and later revised in May of 2021, would waive for a period of three years intellectual property rights protections for health products and technologies

 diagnostics, therapeutics, vaccines, medical devices, personal protective equipment; and

WHEREAS, The TRIPS waiver would allow nations that are part of the WTO to bypass
the barriers caused by intellectual property rights and to authorize generic manufactures in
their territories to begin producing vaccines; and

6 WHEREAS, Unlike most drugs, vaccines are large-molecule biological products which
7 require a great deal of information sharing and "know-how" in manufacturing that patents do
8 not contain; and

9 WHEREAS, In May of 2021, although the Biden Administration agreed to negotiations
10 about the waiver, no government action has been taken; and

WHEREAS, The United States needs to take a proactive role by supporting the waiver
and its implementation as well as promoting the free access of technology and information;
and

14 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges President Biden to not administer 15 any boosters without further scientific evidence regarding its effectiveness on individuals who 16 are fully vaccinated and are neither immunocompromised nor 65 and older and until at least 17 40% of the global population is vaccinated; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges President Biden to provide a timeline of when and how many vaccines will be distributed to low- and middleincome countries; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges President Biden to adopt and implement the TRIPS waiver allowing for patent waivers as well as promote technology information transfer to allow low- and middle-income countries to manufacture, implement,

and distribute vaccinations to end this global pandemic; and, be it

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1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges Congress to support the
2	waiver and its implementation while calling on other nations to do so as well; and, be it
3	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board
4	to transmit copies of this of this Resolution to President Joseph Biden and to San Francisco's
5	delegation to the U.S. Congress, with a request to take all actions necessary to achieve the
6	objectives of this Resolution.
