Section 2. Authority and Role of Municipal Transportation Agency Regarding Paid
 Parking at the Kezar Stadium Parking Lot, <u>and the Golden Gate Park Underground Parking</u>
 Facility, and the Marina Small Craft Harbor.

.

(a) Park Code Section 6.14 authorizes the Municipal Transportation Agency to identify
locations suitable for the establishment of paid parking areas or zones on property under the
jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission, and to set rates for paid parking in such
areas that are closely comparable to the rates set for similarly situated paid parking, provided,
among other things, that the Board of Supervisors approves the location of the paid parking
areas and the parking restrictions.

(b) In accordance with Park Code Section 6.14, the Board of Supervisors approves the 10 11 implementation of paid parking with rates set by the Municipal Transportation Agency and 12 subject to approval by the Recreation and Commission at the Kezar Stadium Parking Lot, and 13 the Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility, and the Marina Small Craft Harbor. The 14 Kezar Parking Lot is located at 825 Stanyan Street. The Golden Gate Park Underground 15 Parking Facility is located under the Music Concourse area of Golden Gate Park. The Marina 16 Small Craft Harbor is located at 3950 Scott Street and encompasses those certain areas in 17 the vicinity of and including the Marina Green. The current parking rates at these facilities are 18 adjusted for inflation but are otherwise fixed. The rates set by the Municipal Transportation 19 Agency at those sites shall be comparable to the rates set for similarly situated parking, may 20 increase or decrease in response to customer demand at particular times or on particular 21 days or dates, and shall be intended to support recreation by encouraging the use of these facilities by recreational users, and by helping the Recreation and Park Department meet 22 23 operating expenses, purchase or lease supplies, equipment and materials for the parks, and raise funds for future capital projects necessary to maintain existing levels of service. 24

1	(b) In accordance with Park Code Section 6.14, the Board of Supervisors approves
2	that the parking restrictions set forth in the Park Code, as amended by this ordinance and as
3	they may be amended in the future from time to time, shall apply to any such system of paid
4	parking. Nothing in this ordinance will be deemed to modify or supersede the Lease dated
5	December 24, 2004, as amended, between the Music Concourse Community Partnership and
6	the City and County of San Francisco and the Golden Gate Park Concourse Authority, relating
7	to the Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility and the debt secured by the parking
8	facility.

10	Section 3. The Park Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 6.01, 6.02, 6.10,

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

6 Section 5. Future Updates to Park Code Sections 12.08 and 12.35. Park Code 7 Sections 12.08(a) and 12.35(a) contain rates previously approved by the Board of Supervisors 8 for parking at the Kezar Stadium Parking Lot and Golden Gate Park Concourse Underground 9 Parking Facility. This ordinance approves of the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) setting new parking rates at those facilities with the approval of the 10 Recreation and Park Commission, but the rate-setting and approvals have not yet occurred, 11 12 so the existing rates in the Park Code, adjusted in accordance with Park Code Section 12.20, 13 shall continue to apply in the interim. The Recreation and Park Department is directed to 14 notify the City Attorney's Office in writing once SFMTA has commenced setting rates at those 15 facilities with approval of the Recreation and Park Commission. Upon receiving such notice, the City Attorney's Office shall cause Sections 12.08 and 12.35 to be revised accordingly. 16

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Park Code - Parking Fees]

Ordinance authorizing the Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) to set parking rates at the Kezar Parking Lot and Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility in accordance with existing Park Code provisions that authorize SFMTA rate-setting on park property; making conforming edits to the Park Code; increasing parking rates for berth-holders at the Marina Small Craft Harbor; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

Rates for parking by the general public at the Kezar Parking Lot and Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility are set in the Park Code. The Park Code rates are adjusted annually for inflation but are otherwise fixed. Under Park Code Section 6.14, however, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) may take over setting parking rates at designated locations on park property, subject to certain approvals by the Board of Supervisors and Recreation and Park Commission, and set rates that are closely comparable to the rates for similarly situated paid parking. The Park Code also sets parking rates for persons who hold licenses to berth vessels at the Marina Small Craft Harbor: berthholders get two free parking passes with their berthing licenses, and can purchase additional passes for \$156 each.

Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance would allow SFMTA, with Recreation and Park Commission approval, to set new rates for parking by the general public at the Kezar Parking Lot and Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility. Once SFMTA sets its rates, the existing Park Code rates at those facilities would cease to apply. SFMTA could increase or decrease its rates in response to customer demand at particular times or on particular days or dates. The rate-setting is intended to support recreation. Meanwhile, the Park Code rate for berthholders to purchase additional parking passes would increase to \$600.

Background

This version of the digest reflects amendments to 1) remove the authorization for SFMTA to set a rate for parking by the general public at the Marina Small Craft Harbor; 2) revert to the existing Park Code rates for daily parking, special event parking, and trailer/dingy parking at the Marina (these rates were originally proposed to be deleted); and 3) clarify that the ordinance does not supersede the terms of the lease of the Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility to the Music Concourse Community Partnership.

In accordance with Park Code, Section 6.14, the Board of Supervisors approves the implementation of paid parking with rates set by the Municipal Transportation Agency and subject to approval by the Recreation and Park Commission at the Kezar Stadium Parking Lot, the Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility, and the Marina Small Craft Harbor.

If the legislation passes, excluding the Kezar Stadium Parking Lot, the daily fee for parking on other Recreation and Park Department property, except for garages and specifically designated parking lots subject to separate fee-setting procedures, shall be from \$0.50 to \$1 per hour, the amount to be determined by the Recreation and Park Commission after considering the costs of parking in the areas adjacent to the park property.

Additionally, the rate for berthholders at the Marina Small Craft Harbor to purchase each additional permit would increase from \$120 to \$600 annually.

On March 17, 2020, the Board of Supervisors (Board) authorized their Board and Committee meetings to convene remotely and allow remote public comment via teleconference. Effective June 29, 2021, full Board meetings began to reconvene for in-person Board proceedings. Committee meetings will continue to convene remotely until further notice. The Sunset-Parkside Education and Action Committee (SPEAK) is a 501(c)3 organization which has been an active voice in the Sunset-Parkside district for over 50 years. We represent residents in this area that borders Ocean Beach and Golden Gate Park.

We oppose the proposal by the GGNRA to charge for parking at various nearby national parks in San Francisco.

The GGNRA has proposed to charge \$3.00 an hour to park a car to visit these parks with a maximum charge of \$10. We support our parks, but we also support access to our parks by San Francisco residents. This fee will discourage San Franciscans from coming to these parks to enjoy the magnificent ocean views, to experience wildlife in a natural setting, and to get a respite from the stresses of urban life, made even more difficult during the COVID pandemic.

We also wonder why there have been no public notices posted in the proposed fee areas. At any time, but especially during the COVID pandemic, it is vital that government agencies make every effort to inform the public of any proposed changes that will impact access to their public lands. Notices should be posted at all of the proposed fee locations, and the comment period should be extended 30 days from the posting of the notices.

According to the GGNRA website,

"The proposal calls for parking fees to be in effect at these locations between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., which means that people visiting outside these hours would not be charged for parking. Many visitors to the park travel by bicycle or foot, and public transit which operates in close vicinity to many of the affected parking lots, including Stinson Beach, Lands End and Baker Beach, offers an inexpensive alternative to driving."

Let's unpack this statement.

 It is accompanied by a photo of a healthy, relatively young person on a bicycle. However, the majority of people in SF do not bike from one end of the city to the other because of various reasons -- disabilities, dangerous streets, the cost of a good bicycle, and due to the hilly nature of the City - a bicyclist has to be in good shape to get around.

- 2. "People visiting outside [the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.] would not be charged for parking." It gets dark at 5:00 p.m. during the winter months and the sun at times does not rise until 7:30 a.m. So the public might have ½ hour in the early morning to park for free. And really, how many families visit parks in the early morning or in the evening?
- 3. Bus service in San Francisco has been severely curtailed during COVID. It is not clear when it will recover or which lines will survive.
- 4. Many people still do not want to expose their health to others on a bus.
- 5. Parking fees will also limit access for residents from the southeastern part of San Francisco, who may have to drive to these areas especially families with small children. Many are lower-income. They deserve the opportunity to enjoy parkland without impediments such as fees. And riding MUNI will cost at least as much as the parking, for 2 adults. It is not an 'inexpensive' alternative. (These families may already own cars to get their children to school and other events and to drive to work.)
- 6. MUNI service is not back to full service, due to COVID. Even when and if -MUNI service is restored, being forced to go across town by bus is going to make park visitation more difficult for most San Francisco residents.
- 7. Charging fees at the GGNRA lots will force residents to park in the lots at Ocean Beach, filling up those lots and further limiting access. These fees set a precedent for charging San Franciscans for access to our beaches. Fees may spread to other park sites, including City parks such as Ocean Beach.

We therefore oppose these fees and ask you to discontinue this proposal.

D4ward is a residents' forward-thinking advocacy group dedicated to meeting the challenges of the future while preserving and enhancing the unique character of District 4 and San Francisco.

As neighbors to District 1 and residents of the western part of San Francisco, D4ward opposes the proposal by the GGNRA to charge for parking at various nearby national parks. In San Francisco Sutro Heights Park, Merrie Way and the Naval Memorial lots at Land's End, China Beach, and Baker Beach will all become less available to the public due to these fees. We support parks, but we also support access to parks by San Francisco residents. The fees will discourage San Franciscans from coming to these parks to enjoy the magnificent ocean views, to experience wildlife in a natural setting, and to get a respite from the stresses of urban life, made even more difficult during the COVID pandemic.

We find the lack of public notice for such a sweeping change to access to public lands to be disturbing. D4ward learned about this proposal by accident, as there has been no notice posted at the lots closest to District 4. During COVID, when the public is often cut off from community meetings and other news sources, it is vital that government agencies make every effort to inform of any proposed changes, especially those involving fees. Therefore, at a minimum, notices should be posted at all of the proposed fee locations, and the comment period should be extended 30 days from the posting of the notices.

Located at the farthest northwestern corner of San Francisco, the national parks are not central to the homes of the majority of the City's population. Fees will be especially onerous for people from the southeastern part of San Francisco, which contains a large number of under-served communities. Due to the distance to these parks, their most likely form of transportation is a car - especially for families with children. They deserve the opportunity to enjoy parkland without impediments such as fees. MUNI service is not back to full service, due to COVID. Even when - and if - MUNI service is restored, being forced to go across town by bus is going to make park visitation more difficult for these families. If a fee is allowed, it sets a precedent. Fees will rise and will spread to other park sites, including City parks such as Ocean Beach.

We therefore oppose these fees and ask you to discontinue this proposal.
