1	[Urging President Joseph R. Biden to Take Action on Sana'a Airport]

3	Resolution urging President Joseph R. Biden to act to reopen Sana'a Airport to civilian
4	travel and help stop the ongoing humanitarian crisis.
5	
6	WHEREAS, Yemen is going through the worst humanitarian crisis in the modern era;
7	and
8	WHEREAS, Over seven years of civil war, regional war, and a suffocating siege, has
9	caused one of the worst famines in the history of Yemen; and
10	WHEREAS, On August 9,2016, Yemen's main airport closed after the Saudi-led
11	coalition imposed restrictions on the country's airspace; and
12	WHEREAS, Due to lack of medical supplies, diseases have spread and caused havoc
13	through the country causing the number of deaths in the country to double; and
14	WHEREAS, In light of this tragic humanitarian crisis, the main supporters of the
15	Yemeni people have become those living abroad, especially Yemeni Americans, who provide
16	support to their families, and neighbors; and
17	WHEREAS, As Yemen's main airport, Sana'a used to be the gateway connecting
18	millions of Yemenis to the outside world, hosting as many as 6,000 passengers a day, and
19	more than 2 million passengers every year; and
20	WHEREAS, When a Yemeni American travels to Yemen to visit their family, they are
21	forced to travel through Aden Airport in southern Yemen, and from there a treacherous, and
22	dangerous journey awaits him; and
23	WHEREAS, Not only is the road from Aden to various cities in Yemen long, taking up
24	to 15 hours by car, but the road is also unsafe because of the numerous checkpoints along
25	the way; and

1	WHEREAS, Recently, a young man by the name of Abdul Malik Al-Sanabani, who had
2	been in the United States for over seven years, was brutally killed at one of the checkpoints in
3	Aden; and
4	WHEREAS, Yemenis have been stripped of their right to travel abroad to seek medical
5	care, conduct business, study or visit family; and
6	WHEREAS, Hundreds of students have missed out on opportunities to study abroad or
7	take up scholarships; and
8	WHEREAS, The humanitarian crisis has become extremely difficult in Yemen, and the
9	danger of traveling to and from Aden is terrifying and life threatening; now, therefore, be it
10	RESOLVED, The reopening of Sana'a airport will give Yemenis a lifeline and ease the
11	humanitarian situation; and, be it
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, The closure of the airport, with its restrictions on commercial
13	imports, humanitarian goods and the movement of people, disproportionately hurts civilians
14	and therefore violates the laws of war according to the UN Human Rights Council; and, be it
15	FURTHER RESOLVED, State and city officials must put pressure on the Biden
16	administration to act on Sana'a Airport and stand against anyone who obstructs the opening
17	of Sana'a airport for travelers and humanitarian cases; and, be it
18	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board
19	to send a copy of this Resolution to President Joseph R. Biden upon its final adoption.
