[Concurring in Actions to Meet Local Emergency - Coronavirus Response - Thirty-Eighth

WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, Mayor London N. Breed declared a local emergency to exist in connection with the spread of the novel coronavirus COVID-19; and WHEREAS, The Mayor transmitted a copy of that Proclamation Declaring the Existence of a Local Emergency to the Board of Supervisors (the "Proclamation"), and on March 3, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the Proclamation and in the actions taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; the Proclamation and the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200228;

WHEREAS, On October 8, 2021, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the emergency by issuing the Thirty-Eighth Supplement to the Proclamation, ordering two actions to meet the emergency; the Thirty-Eighth Supplement is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in Board File No. 211116; and

1	WHEREAS, Government Code, Sections 8550 et seq., and Charter, Section 3.100,
2	provide for the concurrence by members of the Board of Supervisors in such emergency
3	declaration and in action taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; and now, therefore, be it
4	MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors concurs with the following actions taken by the
5	Mayor to meet the local emergency included in the Mayor's Thirty-Eighth Supplement to the
6	Proclamation, dated October 8, 2021, as such actions are described in full in the Thirty-Eighth
7	Supplement and summarized as follows:
8	Action 1: Requiring employees of existing City contractors and
9	subcontractors who spend substantial time working in close proximity to City employees while
10	performing work under the contract at a City facility to be fully vaccinated or granted an
11	exemption based on medical or religious grounds by no later than December 31, 2021;
12	requiring that this requirement be added as a condition of new contracts beginning January 1,
13	2022; and requiring the City Administrator to issue a policy and guidance providing direction to
14	department on implementation and possible waivers.
15	Action 2: Requiring members of City boards, commissions, and advisory
16	bodies ("policy bodies") to report their vaccination status to the Department of Human
17	Resources no later than December 15, 2021, and prohibiting unvaccinated members from
18	attending in-person meetings of a policy body after January 1, 2022, without exception.
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
