18 than 30 years, covering City Hall politics across seven different mayoral administrations, until her  
19 retirement in 2015, which earned her the title of “Dean of the City Hall Press Corps.” Taylor  
20 leveraged her experience as a political reporter to also co-write the Insider column and opinion pieces


