[Concurring in Actions to Meet Local Emergency - Coronavirus Response - Fortieth Supplement]

3 Motion concurring in actions taken by the Mayor in the Fortieth Supplement to the 4 Proclamation of Emergency to meet the ongoing local emergency related to the novel 5 coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic by delegating to the Human Resources Director and 6 the Director of Transportation the authority until December 31, 2021, to waive or modify 7 provisions of Memoranda of Understanding with labor organizations representing 8 sworn employees of the Fire Department and Transit Operators related to 9 compensation, including overtime and premium pay, and to waive Charter or Administrative Code provisions limiting the cash out of accrued vacation balances 10 11 where necessary or appropriate to ensure staffing to carry out essential government 12 services and respond to the pandemic.

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WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, Mayor London N. Breed declared a local
emergency to exist in connection with the spread of the novel coronavirus COVID-19; and
WHEREAS, The Mayor transmitted a copy of that Proclamation Declaring the
Existence of a Local Emergency to the Board of Supervisors (the "Proclamation"), and on
March 3, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the Proclamation and in the actions
taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; the Proclamation and the Board's concurring
Motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200228;

21 WHEREAS, On October 28, 2021, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the 22 emergency by issuing the Thirty-Ninth Supplement to the Proclamation, ordering two actions 23 to meet the emergency that were intended to address staffing shortages resulting from the 24 pandemic and the City's vaccination policy; the Thirty-Ninth Supplement is on file with the 25 Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in Board File No. 211184; and

Supervisor Walton BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, On November 4, 2021, the Mayor concluded that it was necessary to
 revise the scope of the actions ordered in the Thirty-Ninth Supplement, and therefore
 terminated that order; the termination of the Thirty-Ninth Supplement is on file with the Clerk
 of the Board of Supervisors in Board File No. 211184; and

5 WHERAS, On November 4, 2021, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the 6 emergency by issuing the Fortieth Supplement to the Proclamation, ordering two actions to 7 meet the emergency; the Fortieth Supplement is on file with the Clerk of the Board of 8 Supervisors in Board File No. 211184; and

WHEREAS, Government Code, Sections 8550 et seq. and Charter, Section 3.100
 provide for the concurrence by members of the Board of Supervisors in such emergency
 declaration and in action taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; now, therefore, be it
 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors concurs with the following actions taken by the
 Mayor to meet the local emergency included in the Mayor's Fortieth Supplement to the
 Proclamation, dated November 4, 2021, as such actions are described in full in the Fortieth
 Supplement and summarized as follows:

Action 1: Delegating to the Human Resources Director until December 31, 2021, the authority to waive or modify provisions of Memoranda of Understanding with labor organizations representing sworn employees of the Fire Department related to compensation, including overtime and premium pay, and to waive Charter or Administrative Code provisions limiting the cash out of accrued vacation balances, upon a written determination that such waivers are necessary or appropriate to ensure appropriate staffing at the department to carry out essential government services and respond to the pandemic.

Action 2: Delegating to the Director of Transportation until December 31, 2021, the authority to waive or modify provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding with 25 the labor organization representing transit operators related to compensation, including

1	overtime and premium pay, and to waive Charter or Administrative Code provisions limiting
2	the cash out of accrued vacation balances, upon a written determination that such waivers are
3	necessary or appropriate to ensure appropriate transit operator staffing to carry out essential
4	government services and respond to the pandemic.
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
