

 [Accept and Expend Grant - San Francisco Parks Alliance - Annual Support Grants -FY2021 2022 - Up to \$118,000]

Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend up
to \$118,000 of cash or in-kind grants for annual support (for community events, staff
development and appreciation, recreation programming and other activities) from the
San Francisco Parks Alliance in Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-2022.

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8 WHEREAS, The partnership between the Recreation and Park Department ("the 9 Department") and the San Francisco Parks Alliance (and its predecessor organizations) ("the Parks Alliance") dates back 50 years to the 1971 formation of Friends of Recreation and 10 Parks, which was started to cultivate community involvement and investment in parks: and 11 WHEREAS, Through the years, the Parks Alliance has provided funding for both one-12 time large capital projects as well as annual support for Department programs including park 13 14 bench maintenance, community events, youth development programs, and staff development, recognition, and appreciation; and 15 16 WHEREAS, This annual support allows the Department to imbue these projects and programs with a layer of excellence that would not be possible with public funding alone and 17 which has provided significant benefits to the public by enhancing San Francisco parks and 18 19 programs; and

WHEREAS, In accordance with Mayor's Executive Directive No. 20-02, on June 1, 2021, the Department and the Parks Alliance entered into a memorandum of understanding ("MOU"), approved by the City Attorney and the Controller and the Recreation and Park Commission at its May 20, 2021 meeting, which set new processes for coordinating and reporting on this annual support, including a commitment to proactively request

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Commission and Board of Supervisors approval of the annual support budget for the coming
 fiscal year; and

3 WHEREAS, In FY2021-2022, SFPA intends to contribute up to \$118,000 to Recreation 4 and Park Department (RPD) in annual support grants in the following categories as set forth 5 by the approved MOU: \$6,000 to support volunteer programs including supplies for 6 neighborhood park volunteer days; \$20,000 to support community events including city-wide 7 seasonal events such as the annual Tree Lighting: \$20,000 to support park bench 8 maintenance including the purchase of bench slats, paint and tools; \$10,000 to support 9 partnership development and planning including strategic planning sessions and 10 consultants; \$10,000 to support staff development programs activities such as staff 11 training; \$5,000 for employee recognition and appreciation, including employee recognition 12 prizes and employee appreciation events; \$12,000 to support recreation programming 13 including supplies for recreation centers through the GearUp program, and support for the 14 Harvey Milk Photo Center; \$30,000 to support youth development programs, including the 15 Greenagers program; and \$5,000 park and program operations, including general support for 16 park operations and maintenance; and 17 WHEREAS, RPD proposes to maximize use of available Grant funds on project 18 expenditures by not including indirect costs in the Grant budget; and 19 WHEREAS, On June 17, 2021, the Recreation and Park Commission unanimously 20 voted, by Resolution No. 2106-001 to recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the 21 Department to accept this Grant; and 22 WHEREAS, On August 19, 2021, the Recreation and Park Commission unanimously 23 voted, by Resolution No. 2108-003, to authorize the Department to proceed with accepting the 24 first \$25,000 of the Grant, in conformity with Administrative Code, Section 10.170-1(b) which

authorizes the acceptance of grants less than \$100,000, in order to allow underserved youth

who participate in the Greenagers program to be awarded the stipends they were promised
on a timely basis; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the General Manager of the 4 Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend a total of up to \$118,000 for annual 5 support (for community events, staff development and recognition and appreciation, 6 recreation programming and other activities) from the San Francisco Parks Alliance in 7 FY2021-2022, and to perform all acts required of the City there under; and, be it 8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of 9 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it 10 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Recreation and 11 Park General Manager to enter into any modifications to the Grant that the Recreation and 12 Park General Manager determines, in consultation with the City Attorney, are in the best 13 interests of the City and do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities of the City, are 14 necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of the Grant or this Resolution, and are in 15 compliance with all applicable laws, including the City's Charter. 16 17 18 19
