

[Accept and Expend Grant - San Francisco Parks Alliance - Japanese Tea Garden 1 Restoration Projects - Valued Up to \$400,000] 2 3 Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend cash 4 and/or in-kind grants from the San Francisco Parks Alliance (SFPA) valued at up 5 to \$400,000 for restoration projects in the Japanese Tea Garden project for the project 6 term of upon approval of Board of Supervisors until Notice of Substantial Completion. 7 8 WHEREAS, The City, through the Recreation and Park Department (RPD), operates 9 and maintains The Japanese Tea Garden in Golden Gate Park (Garden), located in 10 Supervisorial District 1; and 11 WHEREAS, The Friends of the Japanese Tea Garden, in partnership with the RPD, 12 launched the Japanese Tea Garden Revitalization Campaign; the Friends of the Japanese 13 Tea Garden is a fiscally sponsored group of the San Francisco Parks Alliance (SFPA); the 14 Revitalization Campaign will focus on the restoration of the Pagoda, as well as other priority 15 projects which improve access to and enhance the Pagoda, including the landscaped area 16 around the Pagoda, the Long Bridge, and the Temple Gate; and 17 WHEREAS, The estimated cost for the restoration projects in the Garden is 18 approximately \$2,000,000; the Department has budgeted a total of \$1,700,000 for the 19 projects; the SFPA, on behalf of the Friends of the Japanese Tea Garden, has offered to raise 20 the remaining funds, estimated to be approximately \$300,000; if there are additional costs and 21 if there are additional philanthropic funds, the Friends group has offered to donate up 22 to \$400,000 (Grant); and 23 WHEREAS, On July 15, 2021, the Recreation and Park Commission, by Resolution 24 No. 2007-003, recommended that the Board of Supervisors authorize RPD to accept and 25 expend the cash and/or in-kind grants; now, therefore, be it
