Also, any impact evaluation that would involve surveys, interviews, focus groups, etc. would need protocols in advance for human subject review and approval. Any local IRB approvals, IRB-exempt determinations or institutional non-research determinations already obtained that relate to project activities should be submitted to CDC GAP/Atlanta. Funding for activities that are clearly service delivery may proceed without restrictions,
- 6. RESPONSE TO TECHNICAL REVIEW: The grantee is required to submit responses to weaknesses, restrictions and recommendations noted in the Technical Review. Submit responses in writing to the Grants Management Specialist within 30 days of receiving the Notice of Award.
- 7. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:
