WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has agreed to fund DPH in the amount of \$166,666 for the period of June 15, 2010 through June 14, 2011; and.

WHEREAS, The full project period of the grant starts on June 15, 2010 and ends on June 15, 2014, with years two, three and four subject to availability of funds and satisfactory progress of the project; and,
