Each department shall have discretion to designate department specific priority permits' with ' create a recommended citywide list of prioritized permits and project types and shall use that list to recommend changes to the departments' respective permit prioritization guideline'; state that each department shall retain discretion to designate department specific prioritized permits; set June 30, 2024 as the deadline to approve the list of prioritized permits and project types; set a sunset date of June 30, 2030; and make other clarifying and conforming changes.
