Ordinance: 1) amending the San Francisco Planning Code Section 429 to provide that developers currently required to spend 1% of construction costs for public artwork on any new development project or addition to an existing building over 25,000 square feet located in a C-3 district have an option to contribute all or a portion of that Fee to a City fund dedicated to support public art; 2) amending the San Francisco Administrative Code by adding Section 10.200-29 to establish a Public Artwork Trust Fund, funded through contributions and Public Art Fees, for the creation, installation, exhibition, conservation, preservation, and restoration of temporary and permanent public art and capital improvements to nonprofit art facilities within the C-3 district and within a half-mile of the boundary of the C-3 district to be administered and expended by the Arts Commission; and 3) making environmental findings, Planning Code Section 302 findings, and findings of consistency with the General Plan and the Priority Policies of Planning Code Section 101.1.

### AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE

Ordinance: 1) amending the San Francisco Planning Code Section 429 to provide that developers currently required to spend one percent (1%) of construction costs for public artwork on any new development project or addition to an existing building over 25,000 square feet located in a C-3 district have an option to contribute all or a portion of that fee to a City fund dedicated to support public art, and after January 1, 2013, imposing this requirement on any new development project or addition to an existing building over 75,000 square feet located in a zoning district other than C-3; 2) amending the San Francisco Administrative Code by adding Section 10.200-29 to establish a Public Artwork Trust Fund, funded through contributions and Public Art Fees, for the creation, installation, exhibition, conservation, preservation, and restoration of temporary and permanent public art and capital improvements to nonprofit art facilities within the C-3 district and within a half mile of the boundary of the C-3 district or, if the project is in another zoning district, within a half mile of the project boundary, to be administered and expended by the Arts Commission; and 3) making environmental findings, Planning Code Section 302 findings, and findings of consistency with the General Plan and the Priority Policies of Planning Code Section 101.1.

### 111285 [Changing the Official Sidewalk Width - Portion of Mason Street]
