When the Ethics Commission heard the case of Jewelle Gomez, President of the Library Commission, these were the headlines: "Ethics panel reprimands lesbian library commissioner" (Bay Area Reporter); "S.F. mayor asked to remove Library Commission Head" (SFGate.com); "Ethics to Mayor: Pls Fire Library Prez Jewelle Gomez" (CityReport); and Ethics Commission Must Beg Mayor to Enforce Sunshine Ordinance" (SFWeekly). The question now is how this Board of Supervisors chooses to handle this matter? Will it accept and enforce a politically motivated action, cynically placed by the Mayor before the Ethics Commission, should it recommend removal?'
