### 200394 [Liquor License Transfer - 4763 Mission Street - Calabria Bros.]

Hearing to consider that the transfer of a Type-20 off-sale beer and wine liquor license to Michael Biagio Tufo, doing business as Calabria Bros., located at 4763 Mission Street (District 11), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. 05/04/20; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Planning Department submitted their recommendation for approval; Recommend approval Type 21 license is permitted with a retail grocery store. EXCELSIOR OUTER MISSION STREET NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT per PC Section 745 Zoning District as continuation of permitted accessory use. Accessory use may not exceed 1/3 of total floor area or 500 sq. ft. whichever is more restrictive. Liquor establishments shall provide outside lighting in a manner sufficient to illuminate street and sidewalk areas and adjacent parking. Advertisements in windows and clear doors are not permitted, and no more than 25% of the square footage of the windows and clear doors of liquor establishments shall bear signage of any sort.

- 1) Sales of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. each day of the week; and
- 2) Petitioner shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as depicted on ABC-253.

**200243 [Health, Business and Tax Regulations Codes - Overdose Prevention Programs]****Sponsors: Mayor; Haney and Mandelman**

Ordinance amending the Health Code to authorize overdose prevention programs (OPPs) by, among other things: requiring OPPs to obtain a permit from the Department of Public Health, establishing operating standards for OPPs; authorizing the imposition of fines and penalties for violation of local and state laws governing OPPs and establishing a process by which OPPs may appeal a fine or permit penalty; making it a City policy to deprioritize enforcement of laws prohibiting the possession of illegal drugs against individuals who have accepted referral to an OPP; amending the Business and Tax Regulations Code regarding appeals of certain OPP permit decisions; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.
